It is my pleasure to welcome you to the Andy Warhol Summer Festival, presented by the Queensland Art Gallery's Children's Art Centre to complement the 'Andy Warhol' exhibition and The Silver Factory: Andy Warhol for Kids. Over the past five summer holidays the Queensland Art Gallery has been alive with young viewers and their families enjoying the art and energy of our children's exhibitions and festivals.

As with all these programs, our aim is to encourage your children's engagement with and learning through the visual arts, which we hope will continue throughout their lifetime. To ensure all children can take part, admission to The Silver Factory and all Summer Festival activities is free.

Developed by the Queensland Art Gallery in collaboration with the Andy Warhol Museum, Pittsburgh, 'Andy Warhol' is the first comprehensive Warhol retrospective to be held in Australia. Exclusive to Brisbane, the exhibition provides an extraordinary opportunity for young and old audiences alike to experience and engage with one of the most influential artists of our time. I hope you will return and also visit the exhibition with your family.

The Summer Festival spans the Gallery's two sites — the Queensland Art Gallery and the Gallery of Modern Art (GoMA). Read on for details of the free workshops with contemporary artists, interactive activities, talks and performances over 11 big days, as well as a specially designed children's film program at the Australian Cinémathèque at GoMA.

Also, a one-day Andy Warhol Summer Festival event will be staged in regional Queensland centres on 19 January 2008, where children will participate simultaneously in activities drawn from the festival program at their local regional venue.

Please enjoy the Andy Warhol Summer Festival and all it has to offer everyone in your family.

The Silver Factory: Andy Warhol for Kids

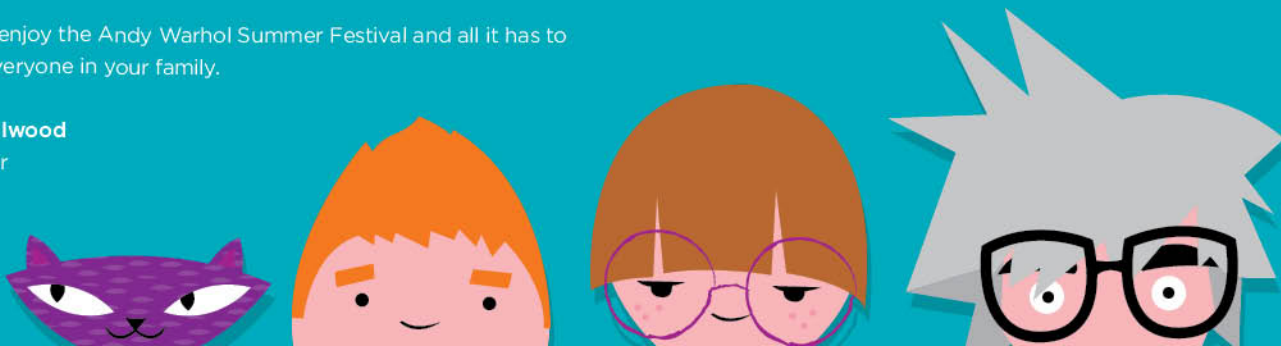

As part of the 'Andy Warhol' exhibition the Children's Art Centre galleries have been transformed into the Silver Factory especially for kids — like Andy's famous art studio known as the Factory.

The Silver Factory: Andy Warhol for Kids includes some of Andy Warhol's art works that will particularly appeal to children. These include a large-scale installation of his *Silver Clouds* 1966, a selection of toy paintings displayed on *Fish* wallpaper and a series of alphabet drawings including "A Was a Lady Who Went Shopping at Sacks" c.1953. The children's component of the exhibition also includes a range of exciting interactive activities developed to complement the works on display and to introduce children to Warhol and his world.

Kids can have their photograph transformed into a Warhol-style portrait and see themselves on the big screen. They can find out more about Warhol and his art by taking the 'Warhol's World' quiz and make drawings responding to his toy paintings and drawings from the 1950s. The Andy Warhol mascot will help guide them through the spaces. The kids' component includes both the upstairs and downstairs Children's Art Centre spaces.

The free kids' activity book includes even more things to see and do.

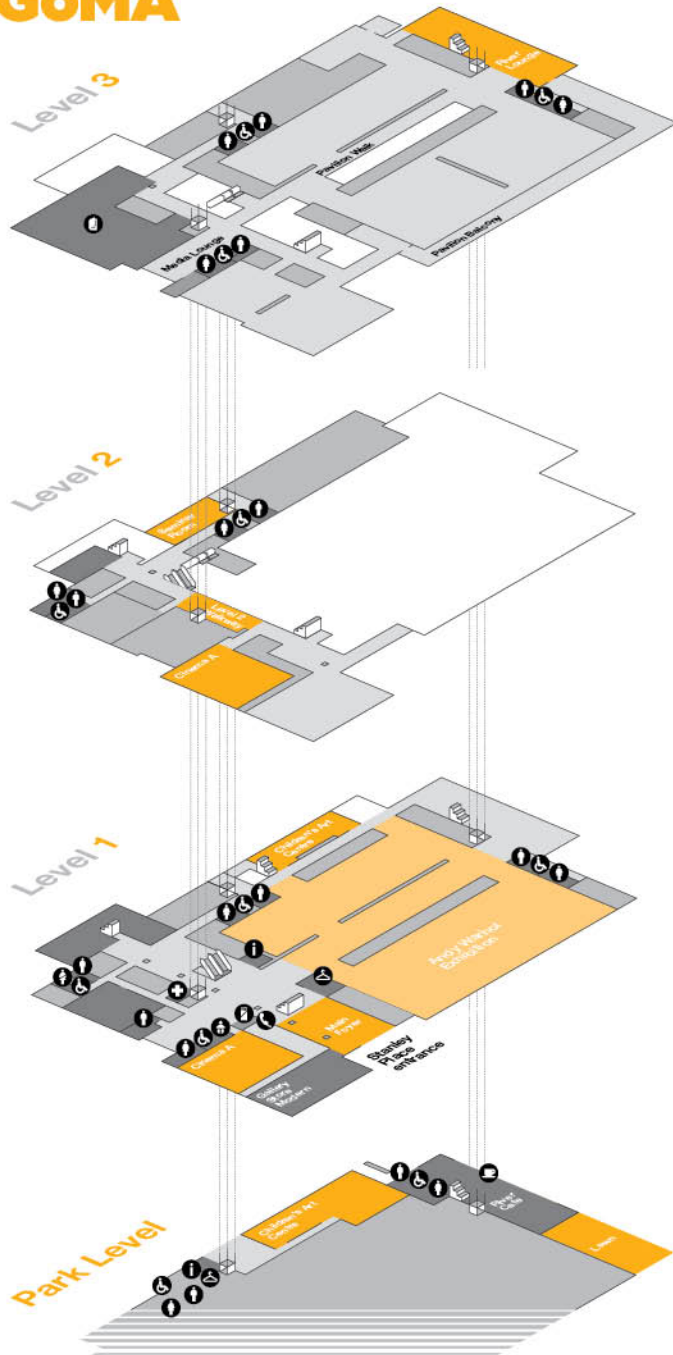

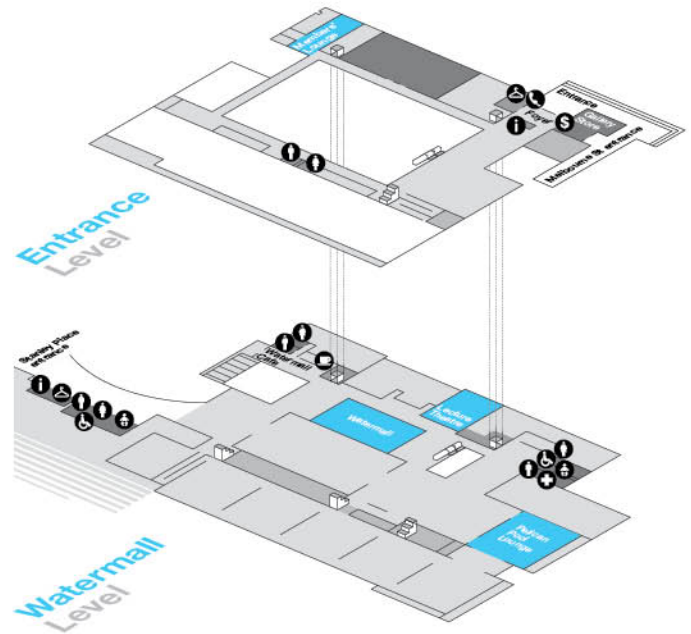
