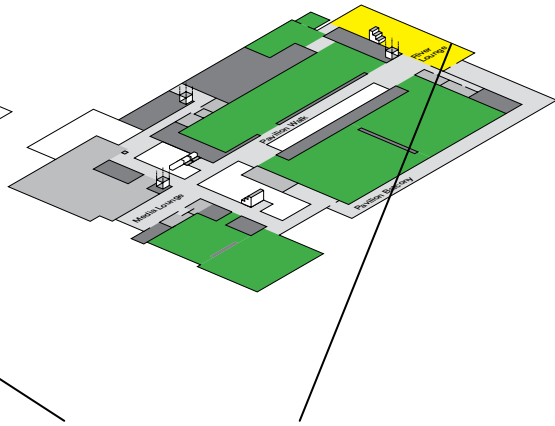
Wit Pimkanchanapong's Fruits 2007–09

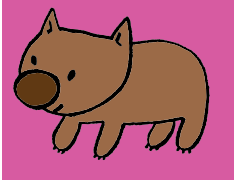
